

## Agastache foeniculum 'Golden Jubilee'



**Agastache** (a-gah-sta-kee) From the Greek *agan*, very much, and *stachys*, a spike, referring the the many flower spikes.

**foeniculum** (foe-nick-ew-lum) Form the Latin *foenum*, hay, referring to the smell.



**Zones:** 5-8 **Flower Color**: Blue

Height: 18-24"

Spacing: 18"

'Golden Jubilee' ', introduced by K. Sahin, Zadin B.V. of the Netherlands in 2002, is a great addition to your garden with golden foliage and complimentary blue flowers. Blooms mid summer to fall with 3" bottlebrushlike flower spikes and grows to a height of 20".

## About the Species:

Family: Lamiaceae


**Common Name:** Anise Hyssop

**Habitat:** Grows in full to partial sun with dry to moderate moisture in open woods, prairies, and uplands of the North East and Central United States and Canada. Prefers sandy, loamy soil.

**In the Garden:** Full Sun. Good winter drainage is a must for best performance.

**Other Uses:** Leaves used in salads, in cooking as a sweetener, and for making a pleasant tasting tea. Some Native Americans used an infusion of leaves and roots for their medicinal qualities.
